In 2014, the Cebu Bon Dance Festival was launched under the auspices of the Japan-Philippines Exchange Committee. From the very first event, the number of visitors far exceeded our expectations, with 11,000 people coming to the event, showing the high level of interest Filipinos have in Japan. The number of visitors and the scale of the event expanded each time, and since the 3rd event in 2016, the Japanese Association Cebu, Inc. has continued to host the event.

In 2019, the Cherry Blossom Festival was held, representing the "stillness and movement of Japan". In the following year, 2020, it was planned to be held again as a Bon Odori festival, but due to the spread of the new coronavirus infection, it had to be cancelled.

In Cebu, the word "Bon Odori" is already well known, and many Filipinos are looking forward to the festival. Furthermore, in 2014, the Bon Odori was awarded by the City of Cebu for deepening cultural ties between Japan and the Philippines and providing opportunities for poor children in the city to play an active role, and in 2016, for advocating the importance of garbage separation.


